



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MEDICINES FIST

Information over the phone

If you have questions about your medicines, call the NPS Medicines Line on 1300 MEDICINE (1300 633 424). Call the Adverse Medicines Events Line on 1300 134 237, to report and discuss adverse reactions. Call from anywhere in Australia for the cost of a local call (calls from mobiles may cost more). Monday-Friday 9am-5pm AEST.

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Adverse reactions

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Other medicines that I have had a bad reaction to are listed below.

Name of medicine Active ingredient / brand name	Strength and how much	Reaction and date	Action taken (e.g. stopped or reduced dose)

Other medicines that must be avoided

This is only a small selection — many other medicines can worsen Parkinson's symptoms or interact with Parkinson's medicines. Check contraindications on the prescribing information carefully before starting any new medicine.

Antinausea medicines to avoid:

- metoclopramide (e.g. Maxolon)
- prochlorperazine (e.g. Stemetil)

The above medicines are a common cause of serious adverse effects in people with Parkinson's. Domperidone (e.g. Motilium) is usually recommended if an oral medicine is appropriate, and ondansetron (e.g. Zofran) IV if not. Note: Ondansetron is contraindicated in people taking apomorphine.

Antipsychotic medicines to avoid:

- chlorpromazine (e.g. Largactil)
- haloperidol (e.g. Serenace)
- olanzapine (e.g. Zyprexa)
- risperidone (e.g. Risperdal).

Some antidepressants and blood pressure lowering medicines must be avoided also. Check the contraindications carefully.
